## Medical Marvels Program



Mayor Bob Weitzner, along with Stella Spanakos, Co-Founder of The Nicholas Center, led a workshop on inclusive parks at the 12th annual Medical Marvels STEM research competition, hosted by The Feinstein Institutes for Medical Research and Northwell Health's Career Services team. The event saw students from 25 schools passionately addressing the improvement of education for individuals with disabilities, leaving a profound impact. Over 150 first and second-year high school students from Long Island and New York City presented innovative research papers aimed at promoting educational inclusion for people with disabilities. Mayor Bob Weitzner commended the students for their hard work and community-mindedness, highlighting Port Washington North's initiatives to enhance inclusivity, notably the development of an accessible recreational facility.

## Planning Board Meeting

The Port Washington North Planning Board recently met on April 30, 2024. The meeting consisted of two public hearings one for a subdivision on Morgan Place and the other hearing was for site plan review on the 44-unit New Oasis Development. The Planning Board had previously granted final subdivision approval in 2008 and modified in 2018. Due to amendments to the Port Washington North Village Code the applicant had to go through site plan review before the Planning Board. After the public hearing, the Planning Board unanimously approved the plans submitted by the applicant's engineers P.W. Grosser Consulting Inc., which were substantially the same as the previous plans submitted by the applicant. The subdivision on Morgan Place was also unanimously approved by the Port Washington North Village Planning Board.
