Village Election Results

Mayor Bob Weitzner, Trustees Andrea Scheff and Matthew Kepke have been reelected to serve another two-year term. Thank you to all residents who participated in the election and the board looks forward to continued progress and service to the Port Washington North community.

Water Main Replacement Project

The water district's water main replacement contractor, Bancker, is scheduled to return to the Village on Monday, March 31st, weather permitting. They will begin milling the road in preparation for a permanent curb-to-curb restoration later this year.

Contractors will be reaching out directly to all affected residents on Fishermans Drive, Boat Lane, Seaview Lane (from Fishermans to Driftwood), Bay Drive, and Port Drive. To facilitate this work, residents are asked to remove all cars from the side of the street where the new water main was installed, beginning Monday. This request applies to only one side of the street.

Oyster Harvesting Initiative

We're excited to announce that the Village of Port Washington North has approved an agreement with Cornell Cooperative Extension to allow oyster harvesting off of our floating docks. This initiative supports ongoing environmental and marine restoration efforts in our local waters.

Oysters play a vital role in the ecosystem by filtering water and creating habitats for other marine life. As broadcast spawners, oysters release their eggs and sperm into the water, where fertilization occurs externally. The resulting larvae are free-swimming for about 10–14 days before undergoing metamorphosis and settling onto a substrate—in this case, recycled oyster shells. This process, known as spat-on-shell, helps form natural reef structures that support biodiversity and improve water quality.

We're proud to support sustainable marine practices and look forward to seeing the positive impact this project will have on our shoreline and community.

We would like to thank Councilwoman Mariann Dalimonte for spearheading oyster harvesting along Manhasset Bay. We also look forward to working with Transition Town, who is partnered with the Cornell Cooperative on this project. Thank you to Residents Forward for their work with Councilwoman Mariann Dalimonte on the oyster gardens at Town Dock and Morgan's Dock.
